PRESIDENT'S REPORT - 13th November 2023

We are hurtling towards the Christmas break – someone once said Australia goes into holiday mode from Cup Day to Australia Day



I attended the All-Energy conference in Melbourne recently and was amazed at the plans for the roll-out of renewable energy (RE) around the nation. The conference had 15,000 people register for the two-day event – 375 exhibitors and 200 break-out sessions. A common theme was the need for faster deployment of new transmission

networks.

On my return I was advised by the COE of TasNetworks that due to the changes of plan for Marinus 2 the new transmission line in our region would be delayed. This places several major projects at risk; Acen's Robbins Island windfarm, Ark Energy's two windfarms around Hellyer and The HIF Global eco-fuel factory. TCCI, Burnie Council and ourselves have been very active in advocacy to all levels of government and will continue to push hard until we can get a satisfactory answer. So far we have agreement from the government that they will connect where required but we don't have a When.



Breakfast numbers have declined in recent months – maybe an indicator of a tighter economy and people need to work longer hours to have success. I urge members to attend as these events are good for networking with other local businesses plus you may learn a few

things that can improve your business.

Simon Overland gave a good presentation on <u>Making a Better Burnie 2044</u> and last week we had a presentation from James Ryan of Lifeline on <u>Minding Your Business</u>. Lifeline are providing free courses to help business owners cope with e extra stress that is being experienced by many during these tougher trading times.
