C Hilliger: Negative press around occupancy. THA stats don't include all businesses, like caravan parks. Numbers are down from 2023, but similar to previous winters – not as bad as made out. People spending less in cafes, but not to do with marketing issues, more to do with economic climate. Tourism similar to pre-covid numbers – cyclical in this region. Focus on Off Season campaigns. Tourists starting to come in winter. Impacted by Dark Mofo cancellation. Permission To Trespass successful – visitor numbers up by almost 1000. Tourism TAS interested in PTT model. Risky approach if no one locked into regional events role. Strategy focusing on: get event that works across winter across the whole region (Strahan > Devonport). Same theme. Use Devonport's lights, use projectors. Leverage funding for winter solstice event. Leverage off what's there & add to it. Lack human resources at WxNW. Model for centralised events coordination in RTO or Cradle Coast with some council funding. 70% of people at our event were locals. Role there for supporting regional micro events and empowering & training locals to run events, but not over-reliance on volunteers. J McErlain: Events folding/slowing down because not enough volunteers. C Hilliger: Difficult to understand about the Spirits issue. Pushing to explore all options. Worried about promised capacity. Discussion on berths, day sailings. Will continue pushing with state gov/premier. J McErlain: Rex loadings are really good. Still don't have owner, but will narrow down. Regional arm is profitable. I Jones: Qantas flight cancellations discussion. Asked question for next council meeting: what are the cancellations for both airlines, what's the on time arrival/departures? Hopefully gets picked up by journalists. C Hilliger: Took out national tourism awards – Stanley & Devonport. Hursey took out best fish restaurant in Australia.
